22/148 Councillors present

Cllrs R Chapman (chair), H Ferguson (vice chair), K Cann, C Keat, N Hatch, J Chapman, A Pooley and E Reynolds. Also present S Cleave (clerk), Dominic Fairman, Cornwall Councillor, and three members of the public.

22/149 Apologies for absence

22/151 To receive and approve minutes of last meeting Councillors approved the minutes of the Ordinary meetin

22/152 Public Participation (15 minutes allowed for this)

One member of the public (MOP) firstly asked if the council knew the result of the consultation that was held on the congestion scheme. Cllr R Chapman said no. The MOP said at the last meeting he asked for a parish vote on the scheme and the parish council had refused. This was disputed by the chair. The MOP said if a third of the public present at a meeting requests a referendum, there has to be one, as he was one of three present. The MOP said the call of a poll is binding over any group. The MOP was reminded that the congestion scheme is a Cornwall Council project. Thirdly, the MOP said the parish council had given £30,000 of money towards the scheme. Cllr R Chapman said the sum had been earmarked in case the parish council want additional features, such as signs. The clerk will look into the rules regarding referendums and will speak with Mr Mansell.

22/153 County Councillor report - Cllr Dominic Fairman

Cllr Fairman joined the meeting after holding a meeting for residents concerned at the proposed congestion scheme. He said residents are not happy with the loss of on-street parking in the scheme. One resident wrote to Cornwall Council's chief executive about the need for a bus shelter, and now a new bus shelter will be put opposite the chip shop. Unfortunately this will mean loss of more parking. Cllr Fairman said there could be a possibility of some pull in spaces being used as parking. Generally people were supportive of the plans, and it has not been easy to get the finding for the village. Cllr Fairman is also organising a meeting about the phosphates and sewage in the River Camel. It is hoped representatives from the Environment Agency, South West Water and the Rivers Trust will be in attendance. The meeting will be held next month at the Betjeman Centre in Wadebridge. More details to follow.



The clerk's report was noted. This included ordering a new unit for the men's toilet; answering queries from members of the public on dropped kerbs, the council's finances, cemetery cutting and road sweeping; received the internal audit and sorted next steps for the AGAR; filled out Land Registry forms for the transfer of land from St Teath Parish Council; renewed traffic warden contract.
